
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#### A Brief nutshell about Indian Leather Footwear Sector

- Fourth largest foreign exchange earner of the nation.
- The Annual turnover is about US\$ 11 Billion (Rs.67100 Crores) with significant growth rate of 21%.
- India is the second largest footwear producer with annual production of about 2065 Million pairs.
- Nearly 4000 units are engaged in total footwear production (55% belongs to MSE Sector)
- Highly employment intensive and provides jobs to about 2.5 Million people with about 30% women share.


